Concurrent Enrollment

Concurrent enrollment classes are offered to East Hollywood High School students through both Salt Lake Community College and Utah Valley University. This program allows students to earn both high school and college credit while still in high school. UVU classes are offered through two-way satellite called Ed-Net. Classes such as concurrent enrollment film and art classes are through SLCC and are taught by EHHS teachers. Students may also sign up for concurrent enrollment classes on the SLCC campus. Credit earned through either college is usually transferrable to another college.

In order to qualify to take concurrent enrollment classes, students must have a 3.0 GPA. Individual exceptions may be made at the counselor's discretion. In addition, in order to take Math 1050, students must have a 23 on the math portion of the ACT, or must pass a very difficult placement test prior to registering for the class. Students and parents must be aware that these are college courses and require that the student spend more time studying and preparing to get an A or B grade. It is critical that students have good attendance in these classes. Grades received in these classes will remain on the student's COLLEGE transcript forever. Students who receive a D or F in a concurrent class may not be allowed to take any future concurrent classes.

Concurrent classes are offered to high school students tuition-free. This is an excellent opportunity to get some of your general education college classes out of the way for great deal! (Normally each of these classes would range from \$600-\$900 per class). However, students are responsible to get textbooks and other needed materials. These are not covered by fee waiver.
